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Ladies and Gentlemen:

- 1. On July 6, 2010, the North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) filed a Notice of Penalty in Docket No. NP10-140-000, regarding a \$5,600 penalty assessed by Reliability First Corporation (RFC) for violations of Reliability Standard CIP-004-1 R3.2 and R4. On July 19, 2010, NERC filed supplemental information. In the absence of Commission action within thirty (30) days, the penalty would have been affirmed by operation of law.¹
- 2. Pursuant to authority delegated to me in sections 375.311(u) and (v) of the Commission's regulations, I am extending the time period for the Commission's

- 3. consideration of this Notice of Penalty for the purpose of directing NERC and RFC to provide information they may possess that may bear on this consideration.
- 4. Therefore, in order to afford additional time for consideration of this Notice of Penalty, as provided for in 18 C.F.R. § 39.7(e)(1), an extended time period until September 20, 2010 is hereby ordered for the limited purpose of further consideration of the Notice of Penalty. If no further action is taken by the Commission by that date, the penalty will be deemed affirmed by operation of law. To facilitate this consideration, I direct NERC and RFC to file responses to the enclosed requests for data and documents by August 19, 2010. As appropriate, NERC and RFC may seek non-public treatment of information in the responses pursuant to sections 388.112 and 388.113 of the Commission's regulations.³
