2017-2018 Term Elections

The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) [Standards Committee](#) (SC) has two members from each of the ten industry segments. Each SC member is elected by the segment he or she represents. The SC reports to the NERC Board of Trustees and oversees the development of NERC Reliability Standards by performing tasks governed by the [Standard Processes Manual](#), the [Standards Committee Charter](#), and the [SC Work Plan](#).

Any person may nominate any other person to serve on the SC, with the limitation that the nominee must be employed by or an agent of an entity that is registered in that segment of the [Registered Ballot Body](#) (RBB) of the [Standards Balloting and Commenting System](#). The nominee is not required to be the RBB representative from that organization.

Nominations are currently being accepted for each of the ten segments. Election of representatives is governed by the NERC Rules of Procedure, Appendix 3B: [Procedures for Election of Members of the Standards Committee](#).

You may use this form to nominate candidates for segments 1 through 10. You may submit more than one nomination. Please, however, use one form per nomination. You are welcome to nominate yourself.

David Kiguel is an active and engaged member of the Standards Committee (SC). He represented Canada at large in the SC and in the Process Subcommittee (SCPS) since 2008 until 2013, when he retired from a large Transmission Owner, Load Serving Entity and Distribution Provider, after a 36-year long career with that company. He was again elected to the SC for the 2015-2016 term, representing Segment 8, Small Electricity End Users. During three years of his SC membership, he was a member of the SC Executive Committee.

David was a member of the NERC Paragraph 81 Standards Drafting Team and participated in and led many teams of the SC and the SCPS such as reviews of the Standards Processes Manual (SPM), Reliability Standards Development Plan (RSDP), 5-Year Reviews, Reaching Consensus for Standards at the SAR Stage, Review of the Registered Ballot Body Criteria, etc.

He is an active participant in the Northeast Power Coordinating Council (NPCC) where he has been a member of numerous working groups, the Compliance Committee (CC), the Regional Standards Committee (RSC) and the RSC Executive Committee. He also participates in the Ontario IESO's Reliability Standards Standing Committee.

Mr. Kiguel is a registered professional engineer in the Province of Ontario. He is actively involved in Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO), the licensing and regulating body for engineering in the Province. He is the current Vice-Chair of PEO's Experience Requirements Committee. He is also a member of the Regional Electricity Planning - Metro Toronto Local Advisory Committee. David is an IEEE Senior Member (1996), an Engineers Canada Fellow Member (2013) and a 2014 recipient of a Volunteer Service Award presented by the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration of the Province of Ontario, Canada in recognition for his voluntary work.
