NERC Antitrust Compliance Guidelines

Mr. Peterson directed the participants' attention to the NERC Antitrust Compliance Guidelines included with the agenda materials, and stated that any additional questions regarding these guidelines may be directed to Mr. Berardesco.

Minutes

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Committee approved the minutes of the May 6, 2015 meeting as presented to the Committee at the meeting.

ERO Enterprise IT Application Strategy

Mr. Hoptroff provided an update on the IT Application Strategy, referencing the detailed materials that had been included in the advance agenda package. He reminded the Committee of the guiding principles for IT projects and provided a status update on ongoing projects, including projects related to the ES-ISAC, CRISP and document management, noting that NERC had successfully negotiated the right to share certain information relating to the document management program with the Regional Entities.

2016-2018 Reliability Standards Development Plan

Mr. Gugel summarized the draft 2016-2018 Reliability Standards Development Plan (the "RSDP"), referencing the detailed materials included in the advance agenda package. He discussed projects completed in 2015, projects carried over to 2016, and key factors for enhanced review of existing standards. Mr. Gugel reviewed the timeline for approval of the RSDP, which has been posted for industry comment, noting that it will be submitted for Board approval in November, and summarized comments already received. Mr. Gorbet asked about the periodic reviews in light of MRC policy input, and Mr. Gugel responded that the revised RSDP will reflect the commentary. Mr. Cauley noted that the draft RSDP reflects the shift to "steady state" in standards, but that future changes to standards would need to reflect substantive feedback, e.g., from events analysis, performance analysis, reliability assessments and compliance and enforcement activities.

Mr. Sylvain Clermont suggested that the question of what "cost" means in the context of standards should be reviewed by the Standards Committee.

Reliability Standards Quarterly Status Report and Standards Committee Report

Mr. Gugel presented the Reliability Standards Quarterly Status Report, referencing the detailed materials included in the advance agenda package, noting the significant decrease in outstanding FERC directives and recommendations from Paragraph 81 and Independent Experts review. He reviewed progress towards "steady state" and the trend in the actual number of requirements. Mr. Peterson inquired as to the status of regional standards versus regional variations within standards, and Mr. Gugel indicated that the ERO is moving away from regional standards. Representatives of WECC and NPCC confirmed they are reviewing existing regional standards to determine if they can be retired.
