LESSONS LEARNED

- People achieve high levels of performance based on the encouragement and reinforcement they receive from peers, subordinates, and leaders.
- Events can be avoided by an understanding of the reasons errors occur and the application of lessons learned from past events.






- Use the new language to describe errors, events, deviations and violations
- Use the new knowledge to analyze problems
- Recognize the performance mode you are in to minimize the error potential
- Recognize the triggers that tell you a trap exists that increases the probability and potential for errors
- Use the tools to avoid or minimize the impact of the traps


